Tell us about yourself: I have been a Baptist pastor for the last 25 years and have been in ministry for over 40 years having ministered in programs for the youth, prisons, senior communities, and my parish. The Lord blessed me with the gift of being a ventriloquist at 34 and with the help of Clifford, I have been able to bring faith and laughter to many. It's amazing to see the Holy Spirit move through a room of senior citizens and prisoners bringing joy and tears.

Transplant Journey: I noticed a cough and shortness of breath that led me to see a pulmonologist and was diagnosed with Idiopathic Pulmonary Fibrosis (IPF). This diagnosis, nor a world-wide pandemic, couldn't stop me from leading my parish. Services still took place with my oxygen tanks by my side and often in the parking lot to allow for safe distancing. I was placed on the transplant list in May 2020 and received my new lungs on August 22.

You get to share with others and what a blessing that is to share our stories and learn from one another going through the same thing. I also might add the staff is pretty excellent!
